Nigerian award-winning musician, and singer-songwriter, Limoblaze (Samuel Onwubiko) is an Afrobeats, Hip-Hop and Gospel recording artist. With a unique sound and rapidly growing music career, Limoblaze has emerged as a global phenomenon in the entertainment scene with a large following, especially among youths.

One of his recent hits, "Jireh", debuted on Billboard's US Afrobeat song chart peaking at #31; Billboard's Hot Christian Songs chart peaking at #41; and Billboard's Gospel Song chart peaking at #15.

Limoblaze is passionate about sharing the excellence of African creatives with the world. Over the years, he has produced several bodies of work. Among these are five albums; Blind (2016), Before Now (2018), Afrobeats Rap and Jesus (2019), Bridges (2020), God's Favourite Baby (2021) and his latest project, Sunday In Lagos (2022), which have garnered millions of streams across all streaming platforms.







Robin Walker

Robin Walker 'The Black History Man' was born in London but has also lived in Jamaica. He is an entrepreneur, publisher, educator, and author.

From 1987 to 1990, he read Economics at the London School of Economics. In 1991 and 1992, he studied African World Studies with the brilliant Dr Femi Biko and later with Mr Kenny Bakie. Between 1993 and 1994, he trained as a secondary school teacher at Edge Hill College (linked to the University of Lancaster). In 2006 Walker wrote the seminal When We Ruled. It is the most advanced synthesis on Ancient and Mediaeval African history ever written by a single author. In 2011 Black Classic Press of Baltimore published a US version of this book.

Between 2013 and 2020, Walker followed this with When We Ruled: Second Edition, When We Ruled Study Guide and Reading Plan, Blacks and Science Volumes I, II and III, Blacks and Religion Volumes I and II, The Rise and Fall of Black Wall Street and the Seven Key Empowerment Lessons, The Black Musical Tradition and Early Black Literature, 19 Lessons in Black History and the ALCS award-winning Black History Matters. He also wrote four books in collaboration with others: Everyday Life in an Early West African Empire, African Mathematics: History, Study Guide and Classroom Lessons, Black British History: Black Influences on British Culture 1948–2016 and 30 Black History Icons.


In 2022 he co-founded the online adult education business, The Black Secret, which teaches Black History and African Heritage to adults. For the School of New Africa, he can offer attendance to the meetings, fact-checking of scripts, and curriculum designs, endorsement for advertisements, and assist with linking SONA with other organisations and institutions.

Tokini was named a World Economic Forum Young Global Leader in 2023 and listed as one of the 100 Most Influential Africans in 2022.


She holds a law degree with first-class honours from the London School of Economics & Political Science (LSE) and an MBA from INSEAD.



Ade has had his poem 'Let Me Be Me' published by The Happy Newspaper, which has now reached over 2000 schools in the U.K.

She now studies music at the University of Birmingham and, during her studies, has worked with multiple organisations. She is the music assistant at The Birmingham Royal Ballet, sits on the artistic board of The City of Birmingham Symphony orchestra and worked with The European Strings Teachers Association on their 2023 International Conference.

The challenges surrounding diversity in the classical music industry are at the forefront of her agenda. Her work leading the Black Voices Campaign with an agenda to improve black students' experience at the University of Birmingham has created spaces for black students to discuss mental health, racism, reparations, and a vast array of topics. Since 2021 she has played in a freelance ensemble, The Frankland Quartet; she is a recording musician and teaches violin freelance across Birmingham to a range of students from various backgrounds and age groups.







William Awomoyi


William (Will) is a 2nd-year Politics and International Relations Student at St John's College, Cambridge. Infused with Nigerian, Guyanese and Bajan heritage, he's a multi-award-winning public sector strategist with over half a decade's experience in governance across local, national and international levels. Currently, he serves as the UK's Youth Ambassador to the Commonwealth, representing 25 million young people in the UK (aged 25 and under) at the Commonwealth mission.

He started off his journey in governance after being elected as the First Young Mayor of Croydon, presiding over the borough with the largest youth population in London (93,500) on a mandate to reduce serious youth violence (SYV) and knife crime (KC). In his first 2 years as Young Mayor, he successfully campaigned to reduce SYV by 15.1% and KC by 15.6%. He occupied this role while simultaneously representing his borough as a youth MP at the House of Commons.

As a result of his efforts, he was awarded the Bromley Rotary Award and the Diana Award- which is regarded as the highest accolade that a young person can obtain for humanitarian and public service. He also, alongside other Members of Youth Parliament, won the SMK Award for Young Campaigner of the Year Award in 2021 for a combined effort to maintain free travel for under-18s in London following the TFL bailout.







Chido Munyati

Chido Munyati is the Head of Africa at the World Economic Forum. The World Economic Forum is the International commitment to improving the state of the world by leveraging our trusted status as the global platform for shaping the future of economic, social and industrial systems.

Prior, Chido was a Global Leadership Fellow at the World Economic Forum. Modules included: Columbia School of the Arts; London Business School; CEIBS; Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania; INSEAD; Blavatnik School of Government of the University of Oxford; Harvard International Negotiation Program. Chido previously worked as a lawyer at the leading Swiss law firm, Froriep, and the United Nations International Criminal Tribunal for Rwanda and is admitted to the New York State Bar – 3rd Judicial District.

He earned a Juris Doctor at Hofstra University School of Law, where he was awarded a full merit academic scholarship (US\$130,000) and was on the editorial staff of Hofstra Labour & Employment Law Journal and the British Journal of American Legal Studies.







Maudo Jallow

Maudo is an economic development consultant that focuses on advising governments in Africa and the Middle East in the areas of investment, governance, foreign policy, international development and trade. He is a commentator for BBC Africa and Visiting Fellow at the London School of Economics (LSE) Firoz Lalji Institute for Africa.

Maudo has worked for the Boston Consulting Group (BCG), Tony Blair Institute for Global Change (TBI) and the United Nations – providing advice on how nations in the Middle East and Africa can attract investment, create special economic zones and accelerate industrialisation. He has written several pieces on these topics for publications such as the Africa Report, OECD and Future Africa Forum.

In the last few years, Maudo has worked as an embedded advisor at the Office of the President in both The Gambia and Ghana – most notably as a member of the Presidential COVID-19 Response Coordinator's team. He was tasked with tasks that included producing briefings for the consumption of the President of Ghana and his Cabinet.

Maudo holds a Bachelor's degree in International Business with French from Regent's University and a Master's degree in African Development from the London School of Economics and Political Science.







Bright Simons

Bright Simons is a policy analyst affiliated with IMANI, a think tank based in Accra, where he served as Vice President for more than a decade in charge of research. He has been an active researcher, analyst, advocate and activist for more than 15 years focusing on good governance, development, social innovation, and political reform.

He has published extensively and participated in working and expert groups at Brookings, Center for Global Development, The Lancet, and other prominent development-focused organisations. His work and views have been shared by the BBC, Harvard Business Review, Project Syndicate, Financial Times and INET-Oxford, among various others. He sits on the Boards of Care International, Salzburg Global Seminar, and Africa Population Health Research Center.

He is on the Advisory Committees of UCB (a Belgian biopharma specialist), Ashesi University, and Last Mile Health. He was a member of the African Strategy Group at the World Economic Forum and on the inaugural Microsoft Africa Advisory Council.

He holds several fellowships affiliated with the Aspen Institute, Harvard, the African Leadership Institute and others. In 2016, Fortune Magazine named him on a list of the World's 50 Greatest Leaders, and in 2017, he was announced as a Tallberg Eliasson Prize Laureate.







H.E. Patsy Moustache

Patsy Moustache is currently the Acting High Commissioner (Head of Mission) in the High Commission of the Republic of Seychelles in London, United Kingdom.

She started her career straight out of university as a Third Secretary in 2009, in the Multilateral Affairs Division, of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Seychelles and was subsequently promoted to Second Secretary in 2012. In 2013, she was posted to the High Commission of the Republic of Seychelles in New Delhi, India as Second Secretary/Deputy Head of Mission and for 10 months was Chargé d'Affaires ad interim.

Upon her return to Seychelles in 2017, she held the post of Second Secretary (Multilateral Desk) in the International Relations Division, then moved on the same post to the Bilateral Desk in the Foreign Policy Division. In early 2018, she was promoted to First Secretary in the Foreign Policy Division and later the same year, was promoted to Director of World Affairs, Regions and Countries, in the same Division.

Following, the restructuring at the Foreign Affairs Department, she was transferred to the post of Director in the Bilateral Affairs Division, in early 2021. She held this post until her posting to the High Commission of the Republic of Seychelles in London on 8 August 2022.

In 2009, She graduated from the University of Western Cape, South Africa (with a 1-year exchange at Bard College, New York, as a recipient of a Scholarship for the Programme in International Education (PIE)), with a Bachelor of Arts Degree, Majoring in Political Science, History and Tourism Studies. In 2011, she was awarded the Chevening Scholarship, and completed the prestigious Foreign Service Programme, at Oxford University and graduated with a Post Graduate Diploma in Diplomatic Studies.

In 2013, she was awarded an AusAid Scholarship from Australia and completed an online Graduate Certificate in International Studies with the University of Queensland.

In 2015, she was awarded a Master of Arts Degree in Global Diplomacy from the School of Oriental and African Studies (SOAS), University of London.

In her spare time, she volunteers for projects focusing on the empowerment of women/girls/youths, she enjoys travelling, reading and collecting books, thread works and arts, cooking and baking.



Daisy Moraa Ong'angi


Daisy is an MBA Student at the Cambridge Judge Business School and a member of Girton College, the first women's college for higher education, established in 1869 at the University of Cambridge.


She has been Named by Elle- Decoration South Africa Named her as one of the creatives doing something interesting on the continent at the moment


She is also an advisor on the SME action board to the UK Government's Department of Business Energy and industrial strategy and has been selected to represent the U.K. at the G20 startup committee.

This organisation currently has three brands: Niyo Hair and Beauty, Niyo Dapp, and Niyo Bootcamps. Niyo Hair and Beauty is a technology-driven afro hair and beauty ecommerce platform that services over 1000 clients across the UK whilst economically empowering hairstylists through an academy to get accredited. Niyo Bootcamps exist to empower black women to pursue their business ideas and career aspirations through technology-driven boot camps.

She has just trained 400 black women to become full-stack developers, data engineers, and VR and AR engineers through the "BlackCodHER" and "Black Disruptor" boot camps; the projects under Niyo Bootcamps, and is set to empower a further 500 women this year. Some of her women have secured roles in Citi Bank and many more. Niyo Dapp is a blockchain platform set to reward content creators in the beauty sector with NFTs and reward their users with the physical products they wear in their favourite influencers' content.

Her work has been recognised in BBC News, The Voice, Metro, Black Beauty and Hair Magazine, Nottingham Post, and many more. She has also won many awards, including Great British Fashion & Beauty Entrepreneur of the Year, MBCC Entrepreneur of the Year, and Female Innovator of the Year. She has spoken at Women In Tech Festival, Vodafone UK, KPMG, Goldman Sachs, Northrop Grumman, Metaverse Summit, Credit Suisse, Africa Tech Week, Birmingham Tech Week, and many more world renowned institutions.

Kiki Ajayi

Kiki is a 2nd Year Undergraduate at Trinity College, studying Politics and International Relations, and is of Nigerian Heritage.

He is an entrepreneur and founder who loves solving problems for businesses and people worldwide - often using technology. His most successful venture was a peer learning and knowledge management platform for developers within technical teams, that allowed them to have access to the exact knowledge they needed to complete their work faster. He's now building new projects in AI/LLMs. Along the way he's worked with some of the best VCs, founders and businesses across Africa, Europe and America. He's also part of the founding committee of the Capital Angel Network, a network of Angel investors who invest in startups, using parts of the proceeds to support education.

Outside of entrepreneurship he takes pride in academia, particularly in issues surrounding politics and philosophy. His paper titled 'Does Violence have a Place in Politics' was published by the University of Toronto in their Dialexicon Journal. He was a recipient of the John Colet Award during his time at St Paul's and was an academic scholar.







Uche Orji

Mr Uche Orji was the immediate past MD & CEO of the Nigeria Sovereign Investment Authority (NSIA). He was the pioneer CEO from inception in 2012 and completed two terms of 5-years until 2022. Uche designed and operationalized NSIA, and under his leadership, NSIA became a highly regarded global multi-strategy investment institution, as well as serving as a vehicle for implementing key commercial infrastructure projects and investing Nigeria's savings.

Prior to the NSIA, Uche had experience in both the sell-side and buy-sides of the capital markets in Europe, the USA, and Asia. Between 2006 - 2012, Uche was a Managing Director and Senior US/Global Semiconductor Analyst at UBS Securities, New York, where he was ranked top-3 by US Institutional Investors. In this role, he had lead coverage of over 30 companies, including Intel, AMD, Nvidia, Texas Instruments etc., and as Global Sector head, he also had coverage of global firms such as Samsung, TSMC, Toshiba, Canon, Infineon etc. Between 2001-2006, Uche spent six years at JP Morgan Securities, London, as Managing Director /Senior Semiconductor Analyst, where he was ranked as Number One by Institutional Investors with lead coverage of firms such as ARM Holdings, ASML Holdings NV, Philips Electronics etc.

Prior to his sell-side experience, Uche had been on the buy-side at Goldman Sachs Asset Management, London, from 1998-2001, where he was an Analyst/Portfolio Manager working as a co-manager of the pan-European Equity Fund and Global Technology Funds, as well as lead analyst of the Chemical, Technology and Industrial sectors covering companies such Ericsson, Nokia, ASML, ARM Holdings, Siemens, Philips, Bayer, BASF, Clariant, Ciba, Akzo Nobel etc. Earlier in Uche's career in Nigeria, he was Acting Financial Controller at Diamond Bank Plc., Lagos, Nigeria (later acquired in 2019 by Access Bank) and was an audit staff at the firm of Arthur Andersen & Co (later acquired by KPMG)
